- o Have you ever wanted to learn more about emergency preparedness and response, particularly on our campus? PEP 293-002 (and 595-001) will be offered this fall semester on the main campus as a 3 credit hour elective taught on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:00 PM to 3:15 PM. The course is titled "Introduction to Emergency Management and Preparedness" and will cover a wide variety of FEMA topics including: emergency management, incident command, active shooter situations, disaster preparedness and exercise design.
- o The course is open to all students, faculty and staff of the University, and is eligible for tuition remission benefits. My goal for the course is to encourage all participants to become part of the University's trained cadre of first responders know as the Campus Community Emergency Response Team (C-CERT).
